Campus Retention Rate: 56% (July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016 reporting period).

Retention % Formula: Retention percentage = (A-B)/A

A = Beginning enrollment (currently enrolled students), plus Re-Entries (returning students), plus New Starts (new students)

B = Withdrawals: a student who is no longer enrolled at the Institution and:

- Has failed to attend the full length of the program, or
- Has not maintained satisfactory academic progress, or
- Has failed courses, or
- Has not attained skills or competencies required, or
- Is not eligible for a credential, or
- Failed to meet the institution's attendance and/or graduation requirements

Sample Calculation:

Beginning enrollment for period: 700 students

Re-Entry Students: 100 students

New Enrollments: 200 students

Withdrawals: 250 students

Retention rate = $[(700+100+200) - 250] / (700+100+200)$

Retention rate = $[1000-250] / 1000$

Retention rate = $750/1000$

Retention rate = 75%

Campus Placement Rate: 50% (July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016 reporting period).

Placement % Formula: Placement percentage rate = (PF+PR) / (G-U)

PF= Graduates placed in field

PR = Graduates placed in a related field

G = Total Graduates and Completers

U = Unavailable for placement

Note:

Completer: A student who is no longer enrolled and who has either completed the time allowed or has attempted the maximum allowable number of credits for the program of study and did not meet ACICS or college mandated graduation standards (for example, a graduate who did not have the minimum required grade point average).

Unavailable for placement: graduate who unavailable for placement because of pregnancy or other health related situation, is continuing his/her education, is on active military service, or is a foreign national who attended on an F-1 student visa.

Sample Calculation (Refer to Above Listed Formula):

Graduates: 200

Graduates placed in field: 75

Graduates placed in a related field: 75

Graduates employed out of field: 20

Completers: 10

Unavailable for placement: 10

Placement rate = $(75 + 75) / (210-10)$

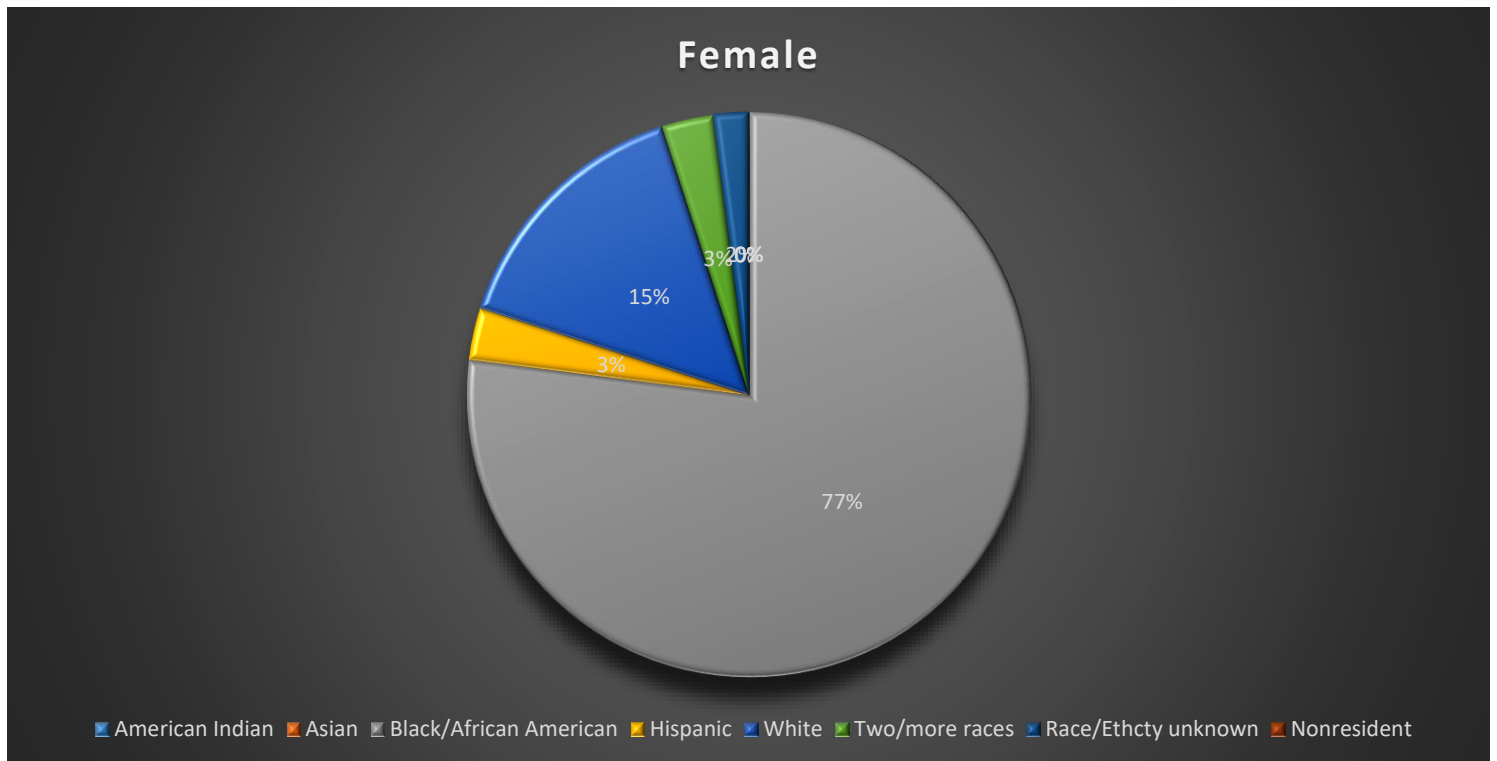
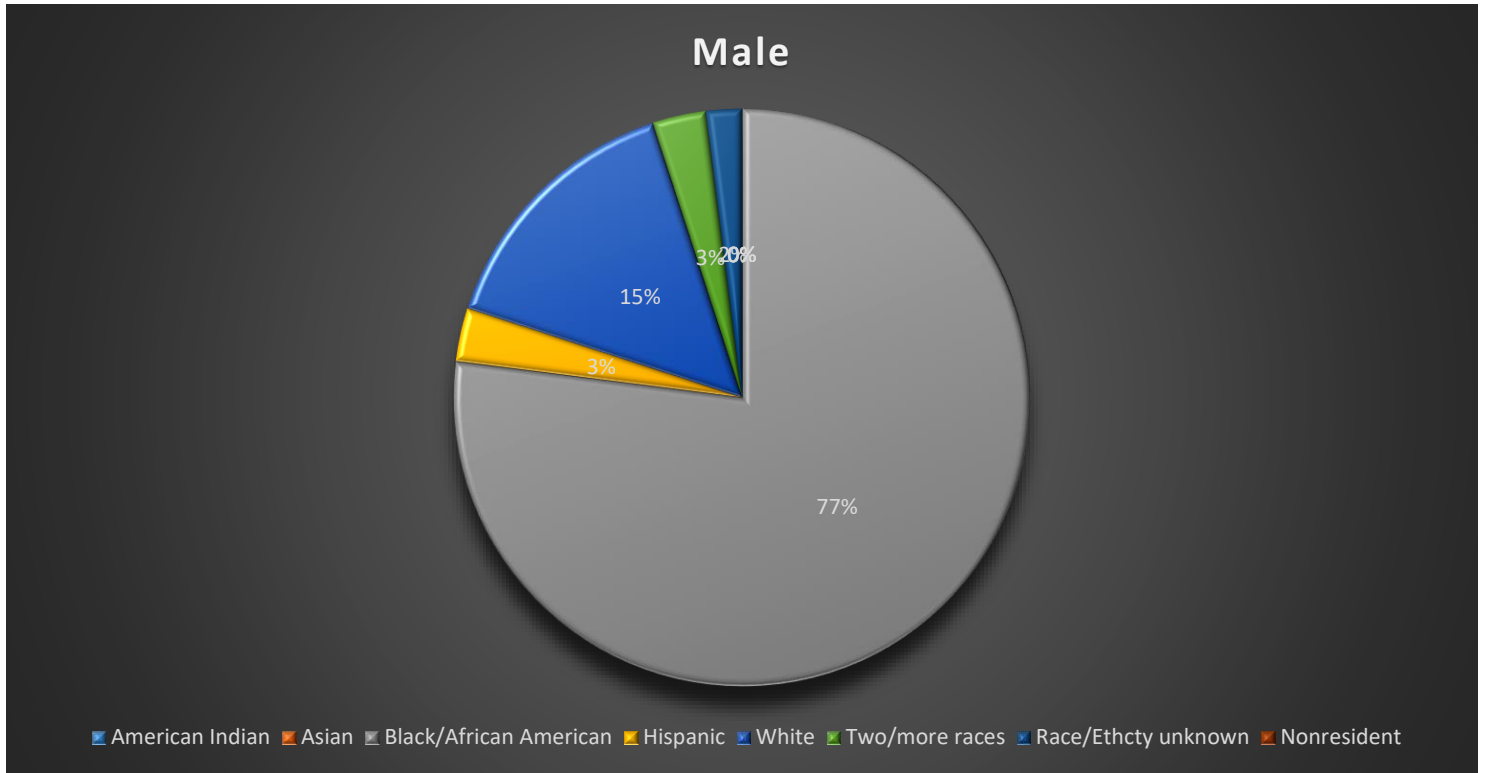
Placement rate = $150 / 200$

On-Time Completion Rate: This rate reflects the percent of graduates between July 1, 2015, and June 30, 2016 who completed their program within 100% of the normal timeframe as described as completing an associate degree within two years and a bachelor degree within four years. All other listed graduates attended at less than a full-time basis.

On-Time Completion Rate:	AS Degree: 1/36 = 2.77%
	<u>BS Degree: 1/28 = 3.57%</u>

Graduation Rate (as defined in IPEDS): As of July 1, 2016, the graduation rates for students that began their education at Jones College in September 2009 (beginning of the Fall 2009 semester), and for whom 150 percent of the normal time for program completion elapsed as of August 31, 2015 (end of the Spring/Summer 2015 semester), is presented in the following calculations:

Note: Graduation rates only include first-time, full-time, students. A first-time student is defined as a student who is entering college for the first time, having never attended another college. Students attending “full-time” take four classes (12 credit hours), or more, per semester. For the purpose of this disclosure, we are listing our first-year, full-time, students who began in September 2009 and completed within the 150% time-frame:
