Jones College reserves the right to modify the chat and instructor assignments found on this schedule as necessary. Schedules posted on official college bulletin boards will be changed to reflect the correct information.

Official-partial Withdrawal from Classes: Students must officially decrease hours through the Dean's Office for classes during the drop/add period in order not to incur charges for the classes dropped. Once the drop/add period is closed, there will be no tuition adjustment for a reduction in class hours even if the student did not attend the class past the drop/add period.

Official Withdrawal from Classes: See the refund policy published in the Jones College Catalog.

New and Reentry Student Orientations for on-ground students: All new and returning students are required to attend orientation.

All students must clear with the Financial Aid office prior to meeting with a Dean to schedule. This will reduce the waiting time a student experiences in receiving funds at the start of the term.

Students may be required to complete a Placement Examination for English and Math to determine the level at which to begin. Classes in Basic Essentials of English and Math will offer 3 hours of credit but not be applicable to the standard degree completion requirement of 120 hours. Those scoring satisfactorily will be allowed to begin in English Composition I and /or College Math I.
